Weekly Events:

<u>Training</u>: The first full week in June after the staff's arrival, Pastor Jim gave his apologetics teaching on "Defining and Defending the Faith." He also included some extra material on "The Problem of Evil" to assist staff in their summer preparation. The following two weeks, Dr. Henry Krabbendam came to give his "School of Evangelism" along with a special morning class on teaching, and then led the staff in evangelism practice with visiting pastors Al Baker and Wesley Hollands.

<u>Week One</u> (June 17-24): New Hope OPC from Frederick, MD, joined us for the second week of evangelism practice under Dr. Krabbendam with his friends. Programs also began that Monday night and will continue throughout the summer!

Updates on Team Activities

Evangelism Team: Please pray for our Evangelists, both the leaders and our volunteer staff as they participate in a number of ministry activities this summer!

Children's Outreach: Friday VBS and Gospel Bracelets. From Morielle: My favorite story is about a family temporarily living in Cape May who made bracelets with me in the morning, then came back that evening with their oldest daughter who prayed for salvation at the Heaven or Hell machine. Most of the family came to church on Sunday. Every chance to explain the gospel using Dr. K's very graphic and memorable "three problems, three solutions" is cool. Aunt Edie asked one kid to recount the beads to her after he made it with me and he remembered every one. It's hard for me to see kids walk off with parents who are in flagrant rebellion against the Lord. But I know my Father loves the children even as I pray for them!



Midnight Dinners. Praise the Lord that the first two suppers for internationals went very well! The first week, there were ten people from China, Romania, and Lithuania. This past Wednesday, there were many more internationals from countries including Egypt, Turkey, Russia, Lithuania, and China! The staff and the visitors have integrated very well and the Lord is working, so please pray for continued working in the hearts of these guests!

Converts and Follow Up. In the past month, we have the privilege to witness God bringing many people to believe in Jesus Christ! We are also seeking to give more attention to follow up. We will introduce new believers and interested people to churches in their own neighborhoods, and we will contact those local churches as well.

Chinese Bible Study. God has brought many Chinese people to the Chapel this summer. In the past two weeks, two Chinese girls, Ada and Katelyn, have come to believe in Jesus Christ! Other Chinese keep coming back to the Chapel so we will start a Bible Study when our Chinese-English Bibles arrive. One leader will teach the Bible Study and our Chinese speaking staff will translate each.

Training and Equipping. The Chapel is developing a more thorough Evangelism Training Curriculum this summer and hopes to better serve staff church groups, visitors, local churches, and seminary students so that they may be equipped in evangelism. We also hope that that Chapel can be a training ground for the Orthodox Presbyterian Church and other denominations seeking to grow in evangelism and church planting.



Music, Drama, and AVL Teams. Continue to pray for Sarah as she oversees the music efforts and coordinates each nightly program. Pray for Teri as she continues to lead the drama efforts and seeks to grow in these areas. Pray for Josh as he manages the stage technical aspects from the sound booth, records training sessions, and works with the other leaders.
